## VILLAGE OF WASKATENAU Regular Council Meeting August 15, 2024

Call to Order

Res.168-2024 Deputy Mayor Tyson Berlinguette moves to adopt the Foreman's

Delegations

Terry Meyers James Littlechilds Terry Meyers advised to Council that he has been experiencing a smell in the water in his residence.

- He spoke to several people and they also advised to him there is a smell in the water. Village Administration advised that no residents contacted the Village Office and reported a smell in their water.
- Water Operator Don Rosa went to Terry Meyer's residence today and ran the tap water, there was no smell or bad taste.
- Don Rosa advised the water that we get from Epcor changes daily. The Village flushes our water lines annually and a water analysis is done annually. Two Bacti samples are taken each month.
- Terry spoke to Dave Franchuk at the Smoky Lake County and he advised the reservoir at Warspite is power flushed annually. Can the Village of Waskatenau flush our water tower.
- Discussion with Council and Don Rosa regarding how the water reservoir system works in the Village of Waskatenau. It is completing different then Warspite's system.

James Littlechilds advised the water is clean and clear but has an odor and advised that data needs to be collected.

 He will be getting water bottles from Health Services and will collect water samples. He will provide a copy of the water sample report to the Village.

Former Nuisance Grounds Reduce Setback An email was received from the Smoky Lake County in response to the Village of Waskatenau request to reduce the setback on the lands described as the former Nuisance Grounds located at 5225 CL; OT (Pt.S.E.16-59-19-W4th). Regulations pertaining to development setbacks for non-operating landfills have changed recently so the process to reduce/eliminating the setback is now different. The discretion for reducing the setback distance lies with the local Development Authority with regulated guidelines to follow.

Renewal of Disposition Res.175-2024 Mayor Richard Warren moves that Village of Waskatenau accepts the Renewal of Disposition from Alberta Forestry and Parks Lands Operations Division for the Weir structure. Carried.

Alberta Infrastructure Fire Pump System A letter was received from Alberta Infrastructure on August 14, 2024 requesting funding assistance from the Village of Waskatenau for the cost of a fire pump system and related infrastructure in the new Holy Family Catholic School.

Res.176-2024

Mayor Richard Warren moves that Village of Waskatenau will not provide funding for the fire pump system and related infrastructure in the new Holy Family Catholic School in the amount of \$348,280.00 as the cost would put a heavy financial burden on our municipality and it is a cost our taxpayers cannot bear. Carried.

Smoky Lake Region Fire Services The Village of Waskatenau discussed the following items to be reviewed at next Smoky Lake Region Intermunicipal Collaboration Committee meeting for Regional Fire Services: Fire Hall Rental Fees and Term; Firefighting and Motor Vehicle collision costs; Volunteer Firefighter Insurance and Special Events Budgets.

Water Meter Reading Equipment Accu-Flo Meter Service forwarded a letter to the Village of Waskatenau from Neptune Technology advising they will no longer be able to support N\_Sight meter reading equipment after June 30, 2024 and customers should begin their transition to Neptune 360, the next generation data management platform. The Village of Waskatenau currently uses the N\_Sight equipment and software for our water meter reading purchased from Accu-Flo Meter Service.

Councillor Roy Krahulec moves to invite Accu-flo Meter Service to a future Village Council meeting to discuss new meter reading equipment. Carried.
